**NOTICE OF STATUS/SCHEDULING CONFERENCE ON WILD  
AND SCENIC RIVERS CLAIMS -- RE: QUANTIFICATION  
ISSUE, CONSOLIDATED SUBCASE 75-13316**

**I.  
BACKGROUND**

1. On October 27, 2000, the Idaho Supreme Court issued its Opinion in the above-captioned subcases, 2000 Opinion No. 106, which affirmed the district court.
2. The Supreme Court held that the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1271-1287 created a federal reserved water right for the following designated rivers: the Middle Fork of the Salmon; the Middle Fork of the Clearwater, including its two tributaries, the Lochsa River and the Selway; the Rapid River and the main stem of the Salmon.
3. The Supreme court held further that the United States was not entitled to all unappropriated flows for the Rapid River and the main stem of the Salmon, but rather to the quantity necessary to fulfill the purposes of the Act.
4. The matter was remanded to the SRBA Court for quantification of the amounts necessary to fulfill the purposes of the Act.
5. On November 20, 2000, the *Remittitur* was issued, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Attachment A, ordering the SRBA Court to comply with the directives of the opinion.
